The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both concentration and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both concentration and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History minor simultaneously fulfill the Social Science core).

Concentration Requirements

24-30 credits required to include:

- a) ENG 100 or ENG 111 and 112
- b) One of ENG 303, 323, 331, 338, 339, 350, or 354
- c) One of ENG 324, 330, 341, 342, 343, 355 or 356
- d) ENG 491 or 492
- e) 9-15 credits unspecified senior-level English courses
